Service to the Lord... On the first Sunday after Pentecost, All-Saints Sunday, the Church celebrates all the Saints whose names may be unknown to us. On this Sunday, the Orthros Gospel is called the "Great Commission." This is where the risen Christ appeared to the disciples on a hill in Galilee and commissioned them to "go forth" and spread the Gospel to all nations. This Great Commission is the charter for the mission of the Church in all ages, as well as for the clergy who minister in the Church.

To be sure, there are different kinds of calls and various forms of missions. No one can take the special place of the first Apostles. And few people today are called to be missionaries to far away lands. However, every one of us in their own way is charged to "go forth." The Great Commission is just as importantly fulfilled through our daily attitudes, words and actions, and by the ways we related to our neighbors, friends, and relatives, fellow workers and acquaintances.

How appropriate that on this Sunday of the Great Commission that we bid farewell to Father Peter and his family, as he is called by that commission to "go forth" and minister to another parish. Father has been called by His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios to be the Proistamenos of St. Barbara Greek Orthodox Church in Sarasota. We join together today to wish him and the family our best wishes and prayers for this new challenge. Father Peter has served at Holy Trinity for the past three years with distinction, working with the youth, enhancing the Church bulletin with his computer expertise, teaching Byzantine music to those interested in continuing the ancient musical tradition of the Church, being available at any given moment, offering the Paraklisis (Supplication) Service once a month and much more and for this we are all grateful. His new



parish will indeed benefit with his talents and his devotion to the Orthodox faith.

On this day of discipleship, which emphasizes that it requires conviction, commitment and witness, we find that in the character of Father Peter. His challenge continues in the Church to transform his flock from members to disciples as is the example of the Saints whom we commemorate today. He and all of us can best honor them when we follow their example of faith and life, becoming ourselves faithful disciples of the Lord. When this happens then the Church is strengthened internally and its sense of mission is enlivened.

Orthros Gospel: In Matthew 28:16-20, Christ commissions the disciples to continue His holy mission.

Resurrectional apolytikion: “O merciful One, You came from on high, and condescended to Your three-day burial to save us from passions. You are our life and our Resurrection, O Lord. Glory to You.”

Apolytikion of All Saints: “Your Church, O Christ our God, clothed itself in the blood of Your martyrs from throughout the world, as though it were a robe of linen and purple; through them, she cries out to You, ‘Send down upon your people compassion, grant peace to Your commonwealth, and to our souls, great mercy.’”

Church apolytikion: “Blessed are You, O Christ our God. You made wise men of poor fishermen by sending down upon them Your Holy Spirit, and through them You caught the whole world. O Lover of mankind, glory to You.”

Kontakion: “The world offers You, the author of all creation, as the first-fruits of nature, the God-bearing martyrs. O most merciful, by their intercessions, through the Theotokos, preserve Your Church in perfect peace.”

Epistle: Hebrews 11:33-12:2 (p. 64 in the Holy Cross book & p. 93 in the new book)

Gospel: Matthew 10:32-33, 37-38, 1927-30 (p. 65 in the Holy Cross book & p. 196 in the new book)

CREED IN GREEK AND LORD'S PRAYER IN ENGLISH

Holy Communion, the Eucharist, is reserved for baptized and/or chrismated Orthodox Christians. According to canon law only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist. Everyone is invited to receive the blessed bread (*antidoron*) at the end of the service. The procedure for receiving Holy Communion is, in an orderly manner, leave your seat, exit from the side aisle, go into the narthex and approach from the middle aisle, receive the Sacrament and exit from the side of the solea, remembering not to turn your back to the Body and Blood of Christ.

Communion Hymn: “Exult, you just ones, in the Lord; praise from the upright is fitting. Alleluia.”

Trisagion: Constantine Bletsis, 1 yr. and Nicholas Prinos, 4 yrs.
